Jim Gamble, is the CEO of Ineqe Safeguarding Group. He is the Independent Child Safeguarding Commissioner of the CHSCP and former chair of the CHSCB - the first to be judged outstanding by Ofsted in both the City of London and Hackney. Jim also chairs the Bromley Safeguarding Children Partnership where he was part of the leadership team that drove their judgement from inadequate to ‘good with outstanding leadership’ in two years.

He is widely recognised as a global authority on safeguarding children and was the founding chair of the Virtual Global Taskforce; a former national policing lead for child protection and the architect and CEO of the UK Child Exploitation and Online Protection (CEOP) Centre. He has undertaken a number of safeguarding reviews, including the Brighton and Sussex University Hospital Trust and most recently the review of Oxfam GB.
